**Howard Gadlin** retired in 2015 after 17 years as ombudsman and director of the Center for Cooperative Resolution at the National Institutes of Health. From 1992 through 1998, he was university ombudsperson and adjunct professor of education at the University of California at Los Angeles, where he was also director of the UCLA Conflict Mediation Program and co-director of the Center for the Study and Resolution of Interethnic/Interracial Conflict. Before moving to Los Angeles, Gadlin was ombuds and professor of psychology at the University of Massachusetts at Amherst. Gadlin is past president of the University and College Ombuds Association and of The Ombudsman Association and past chair of the Coalition of Federal Ombudsman. With colleagues, he has written *Collaboration and Team Science: A Field Guide* (2nd ed., 2018) and *The Minimal Family* (1992). He has authored articles and chapters on scientific teams, mediation among scientists, mediation of harassment and discrimination in the workplace, the ombuds role, and cultural dynamics in conflict resolution.

**Nancy A. Welsh** is professor of law and director of the Dispute Resolution Program of Texas A&M University School of Law. She was previously the William Trickett Faculty Scholar and professor of law at Penn State University, Dickinson School of Law. Welsh has written more than 60 articles and chapters that have appeared in law reviews, professional publications, and books. Welsh is also co-author of the fourth, fifth, and sixth editions of *Dispute Resolution and Lawyers* (2009, 2014, and 2019). She succeeded Harvard Law Professor Frank Sander as co-chair of the Editorial Board of the *Dispute Resolution Magazine*, conducted research as a Fulbright Scholar in the Netherlands, and served as chair of both the ABA Section of Dispute Resolution and the AALS Alternative Dispute Resolution Section. Before joining the legal academy, she was the executive director of Mediation Center in Minnesota and practiced law with Leonard, Street and Deinard.
